# Our Agreement



## The Child

*Parents are asked to talk through these undertakings with their child to make them aware of their rights and responsibilities.*

I will try to:

- be polite and kind to everyone in school.
- work quietly so that others can work as well.
- come to school on time unless I am ill or have a good reason.
- Come to school wearing school uniform and ensure I have my PE kit/swimming kit/coat.
- take home any letters my teacher gives me and bring back any necessary replies.
- look after my school books in my book bag and return everyday

I will also follow our code of conduct:

- Be **respectful**
- Be **safe**
- Be **ready to learn**
- Be **responsible**

## Parents/Carers Will;

- Encourage my child in all aspects of learning, and to praise all good efforts.
- Read with my child and practise number skills through practical activities and games.
- Make the school aware of any special needs my child may have and of any temporary difficulties that may affect learning.
- Support my child in doing any homework given.
- Encourage my child to treat all members of the school (children and adults) with respect and good manners.
- Ensure my child attends school every day on time.
- Send my child to school wearing school uniform and with any equipment or clothing (PE kit/swimming kit/ coat) needed.
- Inform the school of the reason for any absence on the first day of absence by phone if possible.
- Take note of any letter from the school or message about my child's progress or behaviour.
- Talk to staff about concerns.
- Attend Parent's Meetings, Open Meetings and other events concerning my child whenever possible.

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## The Federation will;

- Encourage each child to work to the best of his or her ability.
- Provide work of a suitable standard for each child.
- Keep records and information about the child's educational progress/development in practical and social skills.
- Inform parents as soon as possible if there is any cause for concern regarding their child's progress.
- Provide equal opportunities.
- Encourage children to resolve any dispute through discussion with the help of an adult where appropriate.
- Inform parents if there is any cause for concern regarding their child's behaviour.
- Record absences, and check with parents when no letter or message is received.
- Encourage a respect for others for their individuality, their cultural, ethnic and religious background.
- Produce a written report for each child once a year.
- Be available for parents to discuss any key concerns with, supporting the value of the parent/teacher partnership.
- Keep parents informed of any new policies and developments within the school.
